- It is very soft, malleable and ductile
- It does not oxidise, corrode or alter
- Good conductor of heat and electricity
- Yellow in colour

## Where

- Gold is found in the soil, in the sea water, in rivers, in rocks
- It is often found 'combined' with minerals such as quartz, pyrite, chalcopyrite, arsenopyrite
- Main producing countries: South Africa and China, followed by the United States, Australia, Peru and Russia
- The largest Italian deposit today inactive - is located in the bowels of Monte Rosa. In Valle d'Aosta and Sardini there are smaller deposits..
